Sensory School Supplies Play

Age Group: Infant, Toddler, Preschool

Set up a sensory play area with items related to school supplies. Fill a bin or tray with colorful shredded paper, soft fabric scraps, foam shapes, and non-toxic school supplies like large crayons, oversized pencils, and textured erasers. Let the little ones explore the textures and shapes



while you talk about each item and its use. This activity stimulates sensory development and introduces the concept of school supplies in a playful way.

School Supply Sorting

Age Group: Preschool

Gather various school supplies such as pencils, crayons, markers, glue sticks, erasers, and more. Create a sorting

activity by placing these supplies in a pile and providing different containers labeled with categories like colors, shapes, or sizes. Have the children sort the supplies into the appropriate containers while discussing each item's purpose.

This activity promotes classification skills and vocabulary development.



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Storytime and Craft

Age Group: Preschool

Choose a simple and engaging storybook about starting school or going on adventures with friends. After reading the story together, encourage the children to create a craft related to the story.

For example, if the story is about making friends, they could



create a handprint wreath with their handprints representing friends. This activity fosters imagination, fine motor skills, and language development.

Backpack Adventure

Age Group: Preschool

Set up a pretend play area with backpacks, pretend notebooks, and play food items for a picnic.

Encourage the children to pack their backpacks with items they'd like to take on an adventure or picnic.

After packing, they can pretend to go on a journey to the park or a

magical destination. This activity nurtures imaginative play, fine motor skills, and social interaction.
